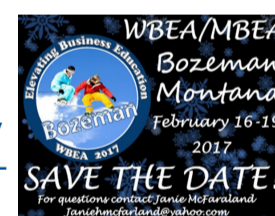

OPI Receives \$100,000 to Develop Career Pathways!



The Council of Chief State School Officers partnered with JP Morgan Chase to offer \$75 million dollars to improve career pathways throughout the nation. Each state was allowed to submit a grant and twenty-four "Phase I" grants were approved. Phase I provides the funding for 6 months of planning as well as assistance in writing Phase II which could bring as much as \$650,000 a year for three years, into the state to pay for the development of the strategies identified in the planning phase.

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
